Particular focus this year: **Social engagement, social cohesion and peace making strategies in community practice.**

Have the option of staying in England at the end of your course to enjoy some travelling, or stay at the University for your final weekend and prepare to make your study credit bearing for a University of Worcester Award (7.5 UG ECTS / 10 PG ECTS /3 US credits). The Summer School facility can also be offered for CPD practitioner awards, and for post graduate study and research opportunities.
