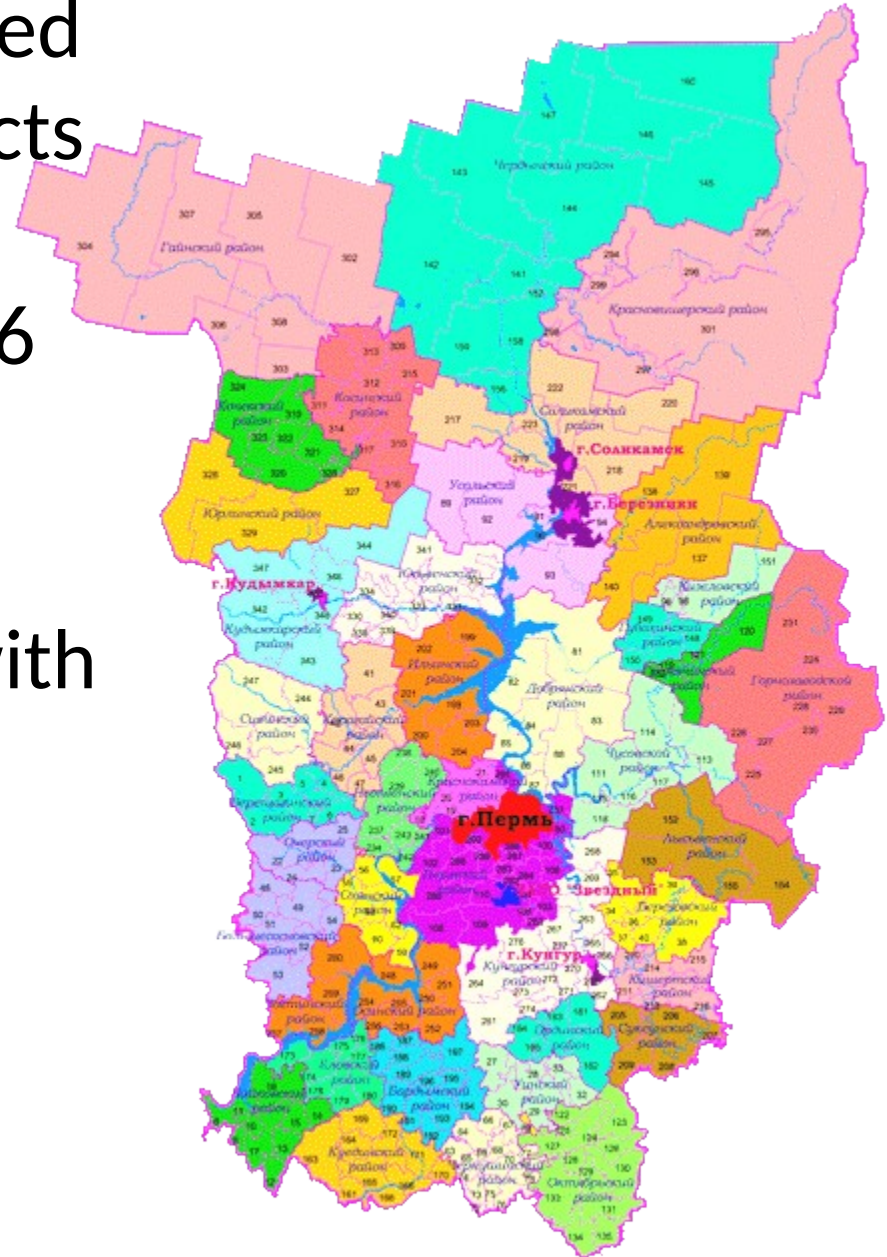

The Perm Region is a subject of the Russian Federation included in the Privolzhski federal district.



The Perm Region is divided into 48 municipal districts of the 1st level - 42 municipal districts and 6 urban districts.

The Perm Region also includes the territory with a special status – Komi-Permian District.



- According to the Permstat the population of the region accounts for 2 637 032 people (January 1st 2016).



Social Problems of the Region

- regional differences in economics and labor markets;
- income inequality;
- low life expectancy;
- a lower level of the provision and availability of major social services outside the regional center.



Education

- In the Perm Region there are 766 preschool establishments, 833 secondary schools, 61 secondary specialized educational establishments and 10 public and municipal institutes of higher learning.



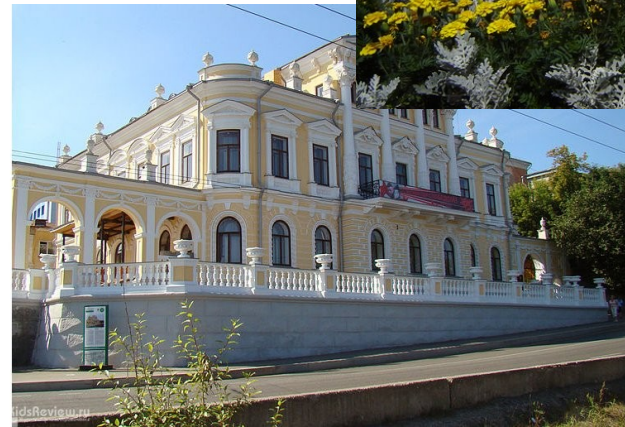
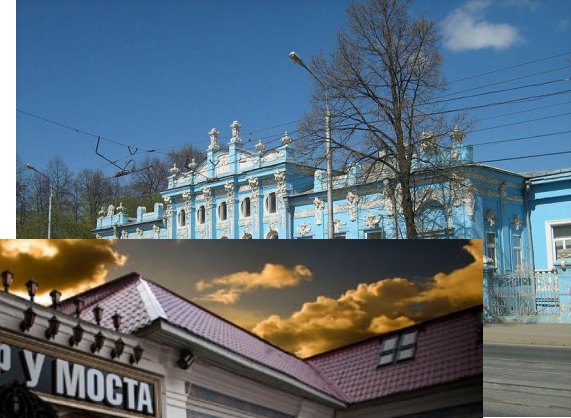
Healthcare

- In the region there is a sufficient number of health institutions where 11 346 doctors of all specialities worked in 2014. There are 28 470 beds in the regional hospitals which exceeds general Russian figures.



Culture

- The Perm Region is famous for its cultural traditions, theatres and museums. There are 10 professional theatres, 18 museums. We have a circus, philharmonic society, the only planetarium in the Ural



The Main Sights of the Perm Region

- «A Visiting Card» of the region are the Kungur Ice Caves.
- The town of Solikamsk is one of the oldest towns in the Urals. There is a unique salt museum there.
- The following towns are rich in famous sights: Osa (the local museum, architectural monuments);
- Cherdyn (the collection of copper and bronze plastic art (Perm Animal style);
- Usolie (architectural buildings of XVII-XVIII centuries).

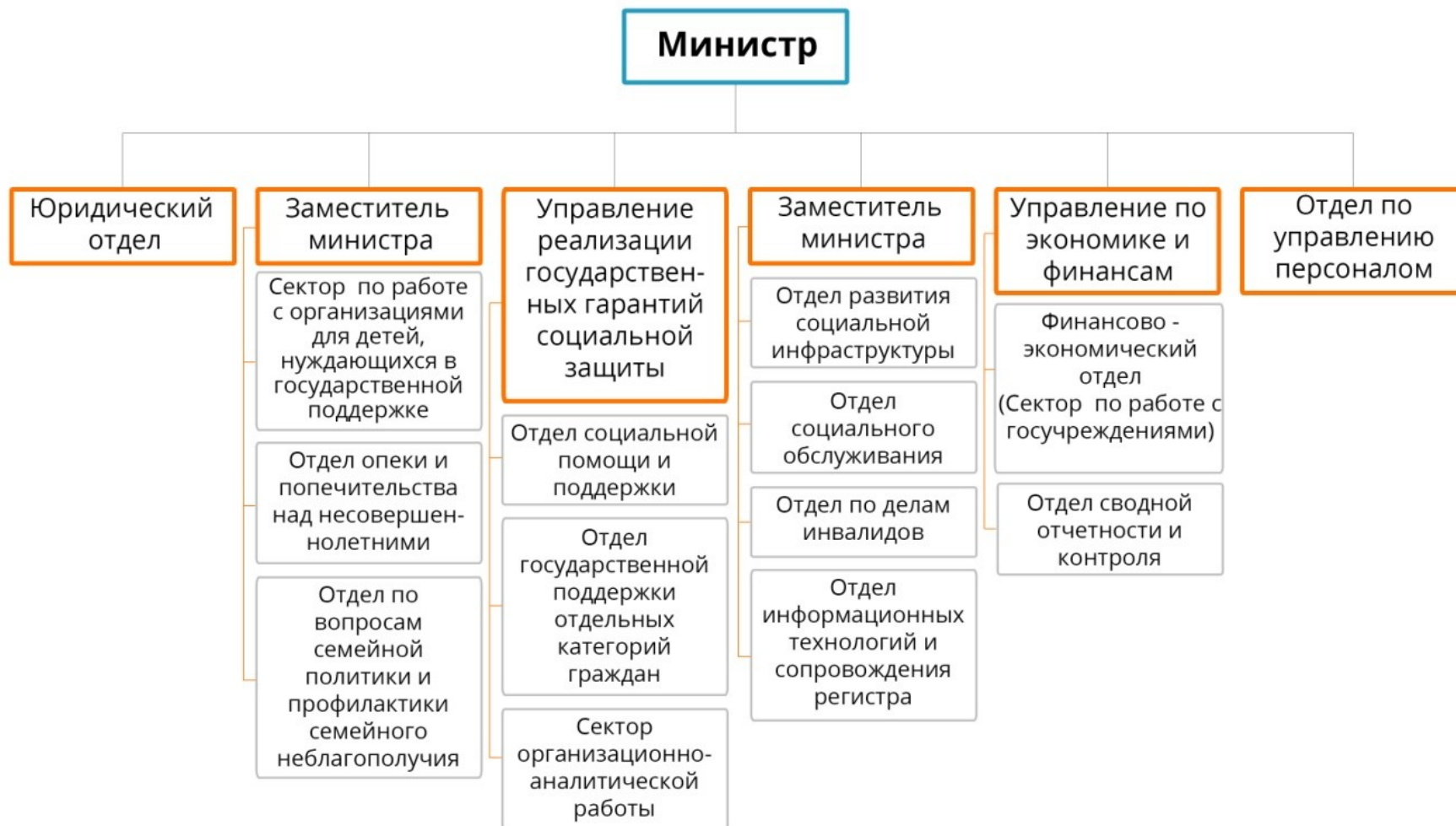

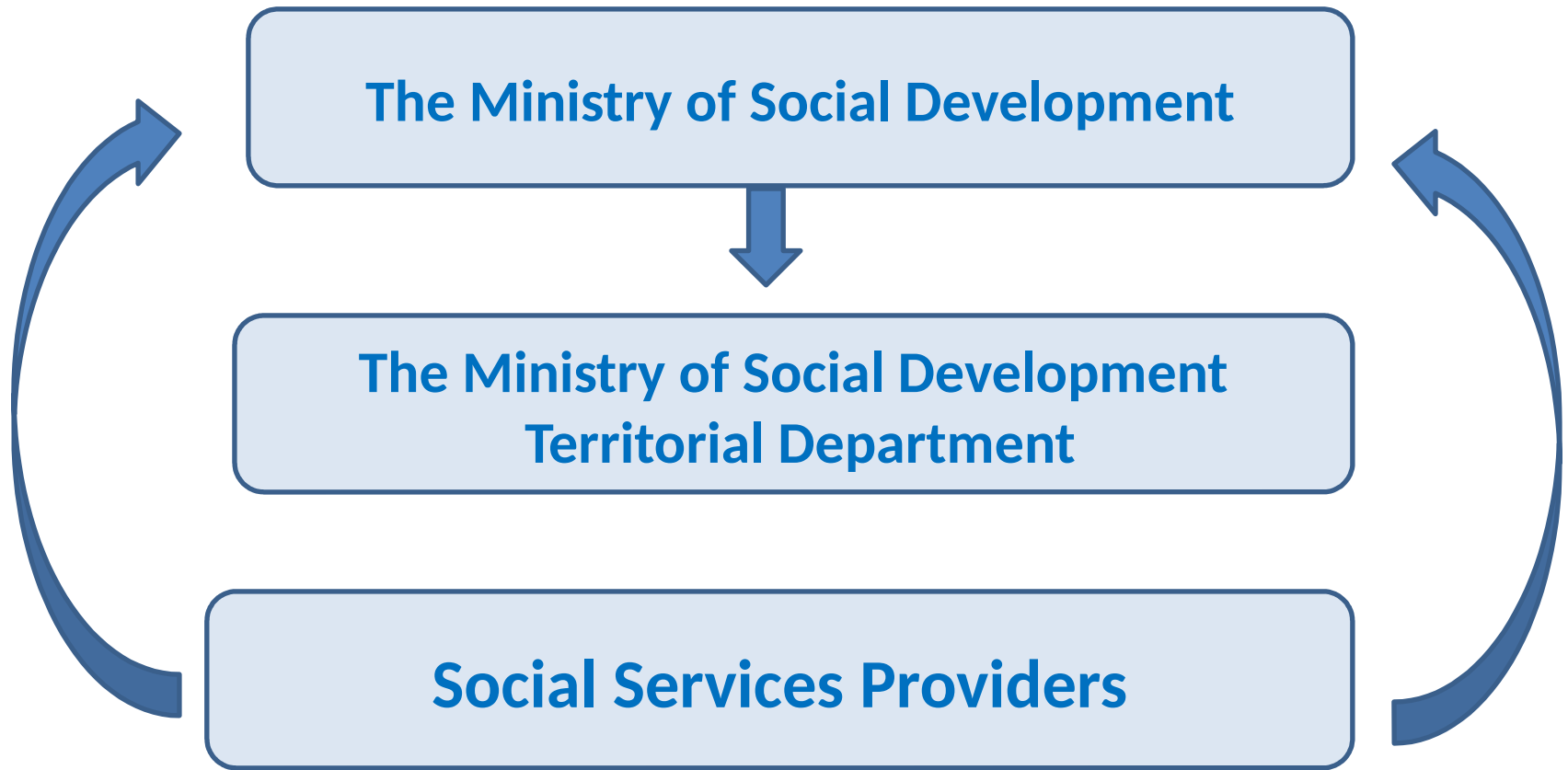

Goals of the Ministry of Social Development:

- the development of the regional policy and normative legal regulation in the area of social protection guarantees for certain categories of the population of the Perm region on issues of social support, social services and social protection of the population.
- the implementation of the functions on providing public (government) services, managing public property of the Perm region in the field of government control over the activities of subordinate institutions;
- the execution of the law enforcement functions in the sphere of social services provision in the government social services system on the territory of the Perm region, as well as in the field of government control over the activities of subordinate institutions.



In the first quarter of 2016 the number of providers, recorded in the registry of suppliers, amounted to 54 units (100%) in the Perm region , among them social services are provided by:

- 32 social services providers (59,2%) - subordinated institutions of the Perm region;
- 18 social services providers (33.3%) - for profit agencies (including unitary institutions)
- 4 social services providers (7,4%) - non-profit agencies (all socially-oriented).



According to the Russian Federation Ministry of Justice Office, in the Perm region there are more than 4,100 nonprofit agencies (NPOs) and non-governmental agencies(NGOs), including the following areas:

- 33 youth organizations (volunteer, sports, student, educational, environmental, etc.);
- 125 non-governmental agencies and not-for-profit agencies engaged in creative and educational activities;
- 24 veterans of war agencies – participants of military actions, wars and military conflicts;
- 49 Cossacks organizations;
- 3 regional organizations representing the disabled people's interests;
- 49 city, district and country women's unions;
- More than 1500 primary and 57 district unions of veterans of war, labor, military forces and law enforcement bodies;
- 20 religious organizations
